Take Your Mark

Funded in part by the Keis Family Fund, the Waveriders Swim Club received \$2100 for a new starter for their timing system. At the annual Gala on April 11, Sustaining Partner Branko Cervienka from WestPark Dental presented the cheque to Waveriders volunteer Angela Swyers.

In 2011, Waveriders purchased a used timing system with the help of Quesnel Community Foundation in order to run their swim meets under the FINA/Swim Canada rules. The starter tells swimmers to "take your mark", it produces a sound and then a flash of light that signals the swimmer to start. This project is to replace the old starter as it has become unreliable.

Waveriders is a non-profit youth sporting team. We are a competitive swim club that trains athletes from the ages of 4 to 17. The goals of the club are to promote, foster, teach and perpetuate the technical and sport of swimming, and to encourage training for competition, self-development, leadership, and sportsmanship in the field of competitive swimming; to promote the amateur aquatic sport of competitive swimming; to stimulate mock meet competition and competitions with other communities and organizations; to develop excellence in competitive swimming according to each individual swimmer's highest potential; and to provide an atmosphere to enhance social development of the individual swimmer in society as a whole.
